


Whether someone needs help with depression, breaking the cycle of addiction finding a job, or obtaining a place to live, we're there when persons need our care.





2012 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Revised Unison's mission, values and vision
- Implemented Nurturing Parents Program, an evidenced-based family therapy program providing parenting skills training to young parents.
- Implemented SOAR advocacy program to assist medically underserved and uninsured persons receive much needed medical and behavioral healthcare benefits.
- Implemented ARISE evidence-based life skills program for teens experiencing problems with disruptive disorders, impulsivity, and anger management.
- Mobile crisis response services to regional hospital and jails.
- Implemented walk-in access to services for persons needing rapid access to care.
- Restructured our underfunded developmental disability services to bring those services into position of financial stability.
- Redesigned our Crisis Stabilization Unit to better serve persons undergoing acute mental health crises.
- Certified 2 staff as Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) trainers
- Expanded organization knowledge and skills by having staff trained/certified in the following best practices:
 - o Motivational Interviewing
 - o Cognitive Behavioral Therapy
 - o Certified Peer Specialist Services
 - o Family to Family Peer Specialist Services



- Served 78 youth in the successful Crossroads program, an alternative high school graduation program for troubled youth.
- Provided Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) to area law enforcement staff
- Implemented Tobacco-Free Environment policy for all Unison programs and locations.
- Raised over \$14,000 for support of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI).
- Completed second year of the Opening Doors to Recovery (ODR)
 research project, a community-based recovery initiative for mentally
 ill persons at risk for homelessness and incarceration.
